ATTHE EPICENTRE OF LISBON, CLOSE TO ALL THAT MATTERS

Only a minute's walk from the Parque metro station, the AAA23 building is less than 15 minutes away from Chiado – Lisbon's "high street", packed with history and a strong intellectual and artistic component, the iconic Praça do Rossio and the lively riverfront. The El Corte Inglés department store with its selection of luxury brands, restaurants, supermarkets, cinema and shops is less than a 5-minute walk away, while Marquês de Pombal – corporate hub and iconic historical square of Lisbon – can be reached in less than 15 minutes.

By car, Eixo Norte-Sul and the Cascais motorway are easily accessed and Lisbon Airport is only 11 minutes away.



On the main façade, a detailed cleaning and consolidation of decorative features was employed by using original materials, thus preserving its elegant and imposing style, typical of the era of when it first made its appearance.

The windows have been reinforced with double glazing and the old window frames were replaced with new lacquered frames which abide by the same colour code and design, thus ensuring better sound proofing and energy efficiency for maximum comfort.





The interiors preserve the decorative features, with stone and wood as the main materials, creating a seamless relationship between historical and contemporary elements.

















PORTUGUESE ARCHITECTURE

The "Português Suave" style, predominant in Portugal in the 1940s and 50s, features architect Pardal Monteiro, who designed great public works such as the Instituto Superior Técnico and the University of Lisbon, as well as private projects like the Ritz and Tivoli hotels.







ARX Portugal

The architecture studio ARX Portugal was in charge of adding another layer to this relationship between past and present, by preserving the façade and retrofitting the interiors to suit modern standards.

Established in 1991, ARX studio has widely renowned works in its portfolio, such as the Music Conservatory of Cascais and the expansion of the Maritime Museum of Ílhavo.
